Primary Responsibilities

This is an advanced professional position that plays a key role in the delivery of services and support to children and their non-offending family members impacted by child maltreatment and other traumas. Primary responsibilities include management of the ABC House trauma counseling program, supervision of mental health counselors and interns, and provision of mental health treatment to children and non-offending family members. Duties include but are not limited to:

- Management of the ABC House trauma counseling program.
 - Supervise mental health counselors and interns, including providing management support, evaluating performance and providing feedback.
 - Assign caseloads to counselors, coordinate mental health service delivery for clients, and consult on complex cases.
 - Participate in the development of overall goals, objectives and policies for the counseling program.
 - Oversee outcomes measurement and analysis for the program, and make recommendations accordingly.
- Provision of strengths-based and trauma-focused mental health services to children and non-offending family members.
 - Provide mental health assessment, diagnosis and treatment of children referred for concerns of child maltreatment or other traumas.
 - Provide case management for clients, including liaising with community partners such as law enforcement, the Department of Human Services and school personnel.
 - Maintain client records according to organizational, state and federal guidelines, including billing information, client demographics and outcomes.
- Provision of training and consultation.

- Serve as liaison between ABC House counseling program and community partners, and provide consultation as needed.
- Deliver mental health-related training to ABC House staff and community partners as needed.

Qualifications

- Master's degree in a mental health-related field.
- Licensed mental health therapist, licensed marriage and family therapist or licensed clinical social worker.
- Experience delivering trauma-focused and strengths-based treatment modalities to children, such as trauma-focused cognitive behavioral therapy, dialectical behavioral therapy, eye movement desensitization and reprocessing (EMDR) or parent-child interaction therapy (PCIT). Knowledge of child abuse issues strongly preferred.
- 3-5 years of experience in clinical management or supervision.
- Strong ability to develop rapport with children and teens, and their non-offending family members and the flexibility to meet their needs.
- Ability both to work independently and as part of a collaborative, multidisciplinary team.
- Commitment to the Vision, Mission and Purpose of ABC House.
